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# WELCOME TO PENANG!

If you have an appetite for life, then Penang is your dream destination! As a melting pot of culture and cuisine with a history that's as ornate as its architectural heritage and as delectable as its food, this unique haven checks all the boxes. Whether you're seeking adventures, an escape to nature, an unforgettable journey through some of the best Southeast Asian cuisine, or a luxe respite at a picturesque resort of your choice, Penang truly has it all.

## A Brief History

In 1786, Francis Light persuaded the Sultan of Kedah to cede Penang Island to the British East India Company and established a trading post to capitalise on its strategic position along the trade route between India and China. It was

paramount that the British acquired a port to provide a layover for their journey between both countries, especially since the China tea trade had become an essential aspect of the Company.



# WHERE IS PENANG?

Penang is nestled in the northwest of Peninsular Malaysia, sitting along the Straits of Malacca. It is divided by a narrow strait that separates Penang into two: Penang Island and Seberang Perai, its mainland, which are connected by two bridges - the Penang Bridge and the Sultan Abdul Halim Muadzam Shah Bridge. The latter is the longest bridge in Malaysia, and the second longest bridge in Southeast Asia, making it a sight to behold in itself.



## Core Zone (109.38 hectares)

The Historic City of George Town covers an area of 109.38ha bounded by the Straits of Malacca on the north-eastern cape of Penang Island, Lorong Love (Love Lane) to the north-west and Gat Lebu Melayu, Lorong Carnarvon and Lebu Carnarvon to the south-west corner. There are more than 1,700 historic buildings within this Core Zone aligned on four main streets of Pengkalan Weld, Lebu Pantai, Jalan Masjid Kapitan Keling and Lorong Love, as well as several perpendicular streets of Jalan Tun Syed Sheh Barakbah, Lebu Light, Lebu Bishop, Lebu Gereja, Lebu China, Lebu Pasar, Lebu Chulia, Lebu Armenian and Lebu Acheh.

## Buffer Zone (150.04 hectares)

The Core Zone is protected by 150.04ha of Buffer Zone (not including sea buffer), bounded by a stretch of sea area around the harbour, Jalan Dr Lim Chwee Leong and Gat Jalan Prangin to the south-west corner and Jalan Transfer to the north-west corner.

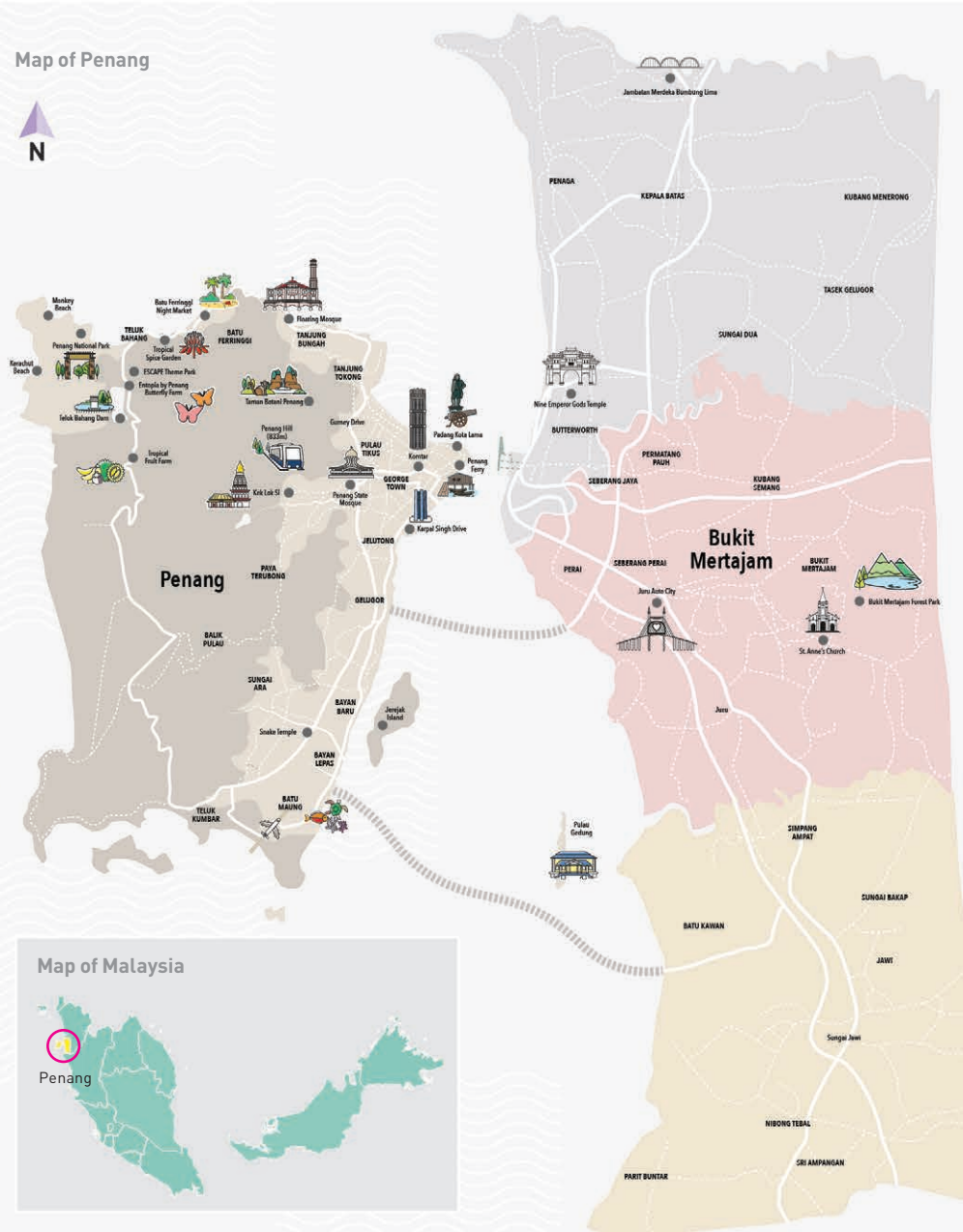

# GETTING AROUND THE TOWN

While Penang Island may be small, there are a number of different modes of public transportation made available. For a taste of old world charm, hop on a trishaw for a leisurely exploration of the city; or board any free shuttle buses to make your way to many of the Island's main landmarks. There is no shortage of options with city buses, taxis or Grab cars (e-hailing service) readily available at every turn. Should you decide to see the sights of George Town at your own pace, the Island welcomes travel on foot. That being said, be sure to pack an umbrella to shelter yourself against the elements.

The bus terminals and train stations also offer rides to other cities; just be sure to check for transport schedules and fares online before making a booking or a physical purchase at the counter. If you prefer to have a free-and-easy tour, then rent a car or a motorbike for easy cruising at your own leisure. Shorter distances are best covered by renting a bicycle or a LinkBike, which are readily available in the George Town city area.

## Trishaws

Oozing with old world charm, Penang's iconic trishaws are the perfect way of seeing the sights around George Town up close. Make sure to bargain for an agreed price before setting out on your breezy sightseeing experience. Here is a tip: the average rate for a two-person ride is RM30.00 per hour, but this depends on the distance between where your journey begins and ends on George Town's narrow streets.

## Buses

Hop on Penang's public bus, Rapid Penang, which operates throughout Penang Island and its mainland. Free Central Area Transit (CAT) buses can also be found in George Town for an easy way to get around. The KOMTAR Bus Terminal can be found underneath the tallest building in Penang, and is the central bus transportation terminal for most of Penang Island's buses. If you're heading out of town, hop on a bus from the Sungai Nibong Bus Terminal or the Penang Sentral Bus Terminal (if you are closer to the mainland), which is your one-stop transportation hub found on Butterworth.



## Taxis

Taxis are easily accessible across Penang Island and are most often found congregated at the airport, bus terminals, and major shopping malls, making it a convenient way to see the island. Most taxis are metered but some taxi drivers prefer to set their own rates, so be sure to settle on a price before hopping in.



## E-Hailing Apps

E-hailing apps offer transport booking service for taxis, private cars, and even executive or luxury MPVs. Grab, AirAsia Ride, Gojo, cALLme Cab and EzCab are just some of the many apps available to help you venture around the island with ease. Just download the app and book your next trip. Payment can be made via cash or credit/debit card.

## Affordable & Luxury Car Rentals

Rent a car at Penang International Airport or in George Town for affordable car rental and leasing options to allow you to experience Penang at your own leisure. Just pay a small deposit fee and you're all set. If you prefer something more luxurious, then opt for a luxury car rental service, which is easily found online. The latter even offers chauffeur services for those not keen on driving in unfamiliar surroundings. Most hotels will also be able to assist you in renting a car during your stay.

## Motorbike & Scooter Rentals

Penang also offers motorbike and scooter rentals which are perfect for navigating the narrow streets and windy Batu Ferringgi roads, and this mode of transportation provides amazing views at every turn. Check with your hotel for the best motorbike and scooter rental options.



## LinkBike Stations & Bike Rentals

LinkBike is a bike-sharing system with 25 stations located in George Town, Queensbay, and Straits Quay. Just pick up a bike at one of the stations with a quick QR Code Scan to release the bike, and return it at any other station that's closest to you. LinkBike is free for the first 30 minutes and costs RM 1.00 for every subsequent hour. For those seeking to rent a regular bike, the George Town heritage zone and Batu Ferringgi offer a variety of bike rentals at affordable prices. Bikes should come with a bike lock and a helmet, and if they don't, be sure to request those essentials before you begin your journey. Stick to the bicycle lanes at all times, and be mindful of traffic as it can get a little hectic around rush hour.





# THE ROOTS OF MULTILINGUAL PENANG

Widely spoken across Penang, Malaysian English is a by-product of British English from the era when Malaya was under the British Colonial Rule. The Malaysian English is more popularly known as Manglish, which is an informal spoken form of pidgin English, and is commonly used on the streets but discouraged in schools.

Manglish is strongly influenced by the Malay and/or Hokkien Chinese grammatical structure, non-English nouns and verbs coupled with Standard English words making it sound like a completely new language. Keep your ears peeled for the word, "lah", for as soon as you pick up on it, you'll hear it being used in most local conversations no matter their cultural background.

Penang Hokkien is a Chinese dialect spoken by close to 63.9% of the Penang Chinese community as well as the Penang Indian and Malay community. Penang Hokkien is a subdialect, which is a mix of Zhangzhou Chinese, Malay and English words.

Most Indians in Penang speak Malaysian Tamil, a dialect of the Indian Tamil language coupled with Malay and English. Tamil is said to have been a common commerce and maritime language used during the 15th and 19th centuries, which is why quite a few Tamil words have even been adopted into the Malay language used today.

## GEORGE TOWN A HISTORIC UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE

With roughly five centuries of trade and cultural exchange between Asia and Europe, George Town is influenced by the cultural diversity of its people as well as its multicultural townscape and unique architectural heritage. As such, on 7 July 2008, George Town, Penang, and Melaka were officially recognised as UNESCO World Heritage Sites. The George Town UNESCO World Heritage Site encompasses a total of 5,013 buildings, consisting of shophouses, mosques, Chinese and Indian temples, and churches located within the 109.38-hectare core zone and 150.04-hectare buffer zones. If you're visiting Penang in July, be sure to check out the George Town Heritage Celebrations and the George Town Festival, held in commemoration of George Town being awarded the UNESCO World Heritage Site listing.





# 6 MUST-VISIT MOSQUES

## Penang State Mosque

Completed in 1980, the Penang State Mosque is the largest mosque in Penang and is a modern masterpiece of East meets West, famed for its Western Modernist architecture. The mosque is inspired by Brazil's Cathedral of Brasília.

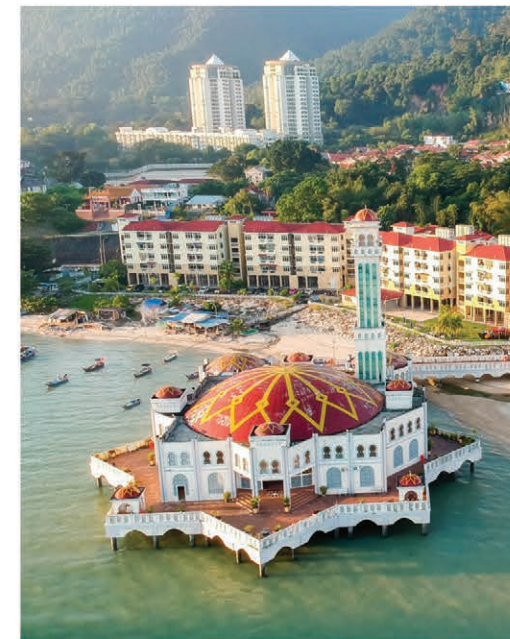

## Tanjung Bungah Floating Mosque

Built in 2004 to replace the old mosque damaged by the tsunami, the Tanjung Bungah Floating Mosque is the first mosque to be built on the sea and is an enchanting sight as it gives off the illusion that it's floating at high tide.

## Kapitan Keling Mosque

Constructed in the 19th century by Penang's first Indian Muslim traders, this Gothic, Moorish, and Roman-inspired monument boasts calligraphy panels and stained-glass windows. It is a splendour to behold, and can be found ensconced between Lebuhr Buckingham and Lebuhr Pitt.

## 6 Must-Visit Mosques



### Acheen Street Mosque

Founded in the oldest Malay village in George Town and built in 1808 by a wealthy Arab trader from Aceh, the mosque was established as a central structure for Muslim traders. With its ivory walls and slender tower, it hovers majestically with its unique Egyptian-style minarets.

### Abdullah Fahim Mosque

Named after the famous scholar Allahyarham Sheikh Abdullah Fahim Sheikh Haji Abdullah, the grandfather of Tun Abdullah bin Ahmad Badawi (Malaysia's fifth Prime Minister), the Abdullah Fahim Mosque's stunning Persian blue minarets and dome that glistens in the sun is a sight to behold.

### Tarik Air Mosque

Situated along Burmah Road in George Town, this humble mosque was built in 1880 at a time when water piping systems were non-existent and water had to be manually collected from the Botanical Gardens Waterfall and transported back to town by hand or using bullock carts. The mosque was where Indian Muslim coolies would perform daily prayers and rest awhile before returning to their arduous tasks.

## THE 7 LAST CLAN JETTIES OF PENANG

Situated a stone's throw from the Penang Ferry Terminal, and part of the Penang Heritage Trail, the clan jetties are floating villages. These stilt houses are homes to the direct descendants of the clans to this very day. Said to be one of the last bastions of old Chinese settlements around Penang, these water villages are more than a hundred years old. Once, there were nine clan jetties in total; two have since been demolished. The most famous and tourist-friendly of these clan jetties is the Chew Jetty. Chew Jetty has the most stilt-houses, the longest walkway, and a spectacular temple that is worth visiting. The seven remaining waterfront communities are:

## Traditional Songkok Maker

In Malaysia, the Songkok has been widely worn by Muslim men since the arrival of Islam in the early 13th century. Today, typically worn during special occasions and prayers at the Mosque, the Songkok has become part of the Malaysian Muslim identity, but its traditional method of creation is disappearing. If you're looking for a handmade Songkok, then visit one of the last traditional Songkok makers in Malaysia, Haja Mohideen Mohd Sharif, who has been keeping this 700-year-old tradition alive for more than 40 years.
